



## COVID-19 International Travel Resources

When considering international travel, jurisdictions may have specific requirements for entry/attendance that are important to know before travelling. There is no one-stop resource to determine these requirements. This document is a compilation of resources that may help the traveller determine requirements.

1. Find Country-Specific Entry Requirements
  - a. Go to the country's government site

2. Find Region-Specific Requirements
  - a. There may be additional provincial / state requirements that are stricter than the national requirements. Check the specific region
    - e.g. check state requirements in the USA: [CDC Travel Planner](#)
3. Find specific Airline Requirements (which often have links to country requirements)
  - a. Go to the airline's site
    - e.g. Air Canada: [COVID-19 Information Hub](#) – see "Entry Requirements"
    - e.g. West Jet: [Advisories: COVID-19 and more](#)
4. Find specific Cruise Line Requirements
  - a. Go to the cruise line's site
    - e.g. [Norwegian Cruise Line](#)
    - e.g. [Royal Caribbean Cruises](#)
5. Check any venue(s) you wish to visit
  - a. Museums, tourist attractions, sporting venues, etc. may apply their own entry requirements.

### Information Regarding [Testing in Saskatchewan](#):

- Individuals requiring proof of a negative COVID-19 test (such as for travel purposes) will be asked to access private fee for service COVID testing companies within Saskatchewan.
  - Information on private testing can be found at the Saskatchewan Health Authority (SHA) Site: [Labs Offering Testing Services](#).
- SHA Testing Sites (including drive-thru) will only provide testing for priority individuals including those who:

- Are experiencing COVID-19 symptoms
- Have been identified as a close contact
- Have had a positive self-test (rapid antigen test)
- Are identified as part of an outbreak situation, as ordered by the Medical Health Officer (MHO)
- Require a transfer or admission to acute and congregate settings
- Require surveillance testing of immunocompromised patients (including chemotherapy, hemodialysis)
- Referrals for appointments can be made by 811 or health care providers.
- Drive-thru testing does not require a referral.
