Uses:

Treatment of major depressive disorder³

Use: Unlabeled/Investigational

Chronic non-malignant pain; abdominal pain associated with irritable bowel syndrome, anxiety disorders (2nd line), ADHD (2nd-3rd line)³

Therapeutic Alternatives:

Nortriptyline (convert at roughly ½ the dose of amitriptyline and titrate as needed), amitriptyline, clomipramine, doxepin, imipramine, trimipramine (convert at same dose as desipramine)⁴

Chronic non-malignant pain – other TCAs; anticonvulsants; SNRIs; topical lidocaine (postherpetic neuralgia); opioids⁵

IBS – other TCAs (amitriptyline, nortriptyline); other treatments depend on presentation of symptoms and may include SSRIs, antispasmodics, antidiarrheals, stool bulk-forming agents^{6,7}

Monitoring Parameters:

- a) Improvement in subjective and objective clinical signs and symptoms/measures of the condition being treated.
 - b) Increase in mood, physical activity, mental alertness, and appetite, and response to environmental events, and interpersonal interactions.
 - c) Regulation of sleep patterns.
 - d) Decrease in psychomotor agitation or retardation.
