Drugs Regulated within the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act include (but are not limited to*):

Opioids/Narcotics such as:

buprenorphine	meperidine – pethidine
codeine (exempted codeine remains Schedule II)	methadone
diacetylmorphine	morphine
diphenoxylate	oxycodone
fentanyl	pentazocine
hydrocodone	remifentanyl
hydromorphone	sufentanyl
levorphanol	tapentadol

Anabolic Steroids such as:

prasterone
testosterone

Barbiturates such as:

butalbital
pentobarbital
phenobarbital

Benzodiazepines such as:

alprazolam	lorazepam
bromazepam	midazolam
chlordiazepoxide	nitrazepam
clobazam	oxazepam
clonazepam	temazepam
diazepam	triazolam
flurazepam	

Miscellaneous such as:

amphetamines (such as mixed salts amphetamines; dextroamphetamine, lisdexamfetamine)
butorphanol
cocaine
ketamine
methylphenidate – in all dosage forms
zolpidem
