Drug Shortages: Glucagon Injection

Health Canada has approved the temporary importation of a limited supply of US-labelled Glucagon Emergency Kit for Low Blood Sugar (Glucagon for Injection) by Amphastar, to help alleviate the current shortage of this medication.

IMPORTANT - Amphastar's US-labelled Glucagon for Injection is NOT considered equivalent to Eli Lilly's Canadian marketed Glucagon (DIN 02243297). Please follow the US-labelling when using Amphastar's Glucagon for Injection. glucagon-10-19.pdf (amphastar.com)

Effective January 17, 2024, US-labelled Glucagon for Injection will be listed temporarily as a **non-interchangeable full Formulary benefit.** The Amphastar US-labelled Glucagon for Injection is now available for ordering.

What will individuals pay for the US-labelled Glucagon for Injection? Individuals will pay according to their usual coverage, deductible and/or copayment.

Can I dispense the US-labelled Glucagon for Injection instead of the existing products listed on the Formulary? <u>Pharmacies should continue to dispense the approved Health Canada products listed on the Saskatchewan Formulary if they are available.</u> However, if Canadian products are not available, Health Canada has temporarily approved the US-labelled Glucagon for Injection for use in Canada.

- If the prescription authorizes the dispensing of a particular strength and dosage of glucagon <u>without</u> specifying a specific brand or product name, then a pharmacist may dispense the US-labelled Glucagon for Injection.
- Because this product is non-interchangeable, if a prescription directs the dispensing specific brand of glucagon (e.g., Eli Lilly's Glucagon), a new prescription would be required to dispense US-labelled Glucagon for Injection
