Tips for Locating Immunization Records

In Saskatchewan, not all vaccination records are stored in one centralized place. Where can you locate your records?



Check at home for paper records

- Books or documents from your childhood (e.g., school or camp forms)
- Vaccine cards provided after immunizations



Check at home for electronic records

- Provincial health registries such as <u>MySaskHealthRecord</u>
- Online applications such as <u>canimmunize.ca</u> (if you have previously entered your vaccination history to track your vaccinations)



Check with current and past health care providers

- Medical clinics
- Local public health authorities, private travel health clinics, pharmacies, urgent care clinics, as well as hospital emergency departments
- Clinics or band offices (if you received your immunizations in a First Nations community)



Check with schools, colleges, universities, other post-secondary institutions

Check with previous employers, military records

Check places outside of Saskatchewan

What if I don't find vaccine records?

- You may be considered unvaccinated and unprotected without a written record of immunization (or proof of immunity to a disease).
- You may need to repeat some vaccines (it is not harmful to receive additional vaccine doses).
- Sometimes blood tests are done to help determine if you are already immune to certain diseases.
